## HOW TO FIND US

Leave the A1 (M) at junction 58 towards Corbridge. Follow the brown signs to Weardale A68/A689, follow signs to Wolsingham approx. 4 miles. You can either park at Wolsingham station (largest car park), or carry on to Stanhope. Weardale Motor Transport Bus 101 serves Weardale from Bishop Auckland to Stanhope. In each village the stations are signposted. Ask the driver for the nearest bus stop. Trains along The Bishop Line from Darlington mainline station to Darlington North Road (museum) and Shildon (Locomotion) to Bishop Auckland.

## STATION INFORMATION & LOCATION

### Witton-le-Wear: DL14 0AJ

Open on timetabled running days – unmanned. Pedestrian access only. Please pay on the train.

### Wolsingham: DL13 3BL

Platform and car park open when trains are running. Disabled car parking spaces available. Tickets available prior to service departure. Tickets, gift and books available. Toilet facilities available. No overnight parking!

### Frosterley: DL13 2SL

Platform and car park always open. Disabled car parking spaces available. No ticket office or facilities at this station. Please pay on the train. No overnight parking!

### Stanhope: DL13 2YS

Station and car park open half an hour before first train service commences. Disabled car parking spaces available. The Lamp Room gift shop open on operating days. Toilets including disabled and baby change facilities available. No overnight parking!

A ramp is available for wheelchair access to carriages at all stations. Staff are always happy to help.
